



## Audit Committee Reviews Budgets of Small Government Agencies

The Joint Committee of Public Accounts & Audit will hold two days of public hearings in Canberra on 20 and 21 August as part of its inquiry into the effect of the efficiency dividend on smaller agencies.

Agencies scheduled to appear include the scrutineer agencies, the courts, the parliamentary departments and the Australian Electoral Commission.

“These agencies are vital to our democracy,” Committee Chair Sharon Grierson said.

“We will be asking them whether they have sufficient funds to do their job properly.”

The Committee will also hold a roundtable with cultural institutions based in Canberra.

“The submissions suggest that many of the cultural agencies have been impacted by the efficiency dividend. They have suggested that cuts they have made to their activities do not sit well with their mandate to grow and develop their collections.”
